SUPER TWELVE

Paris Saint-Germain has won 12 times in 12 games since the beginning of the season, all competitions included. No other team has done it this season so far in its domestic league and EHF Champions League. The Rouge et Bleu started by winning their fourth Trophée des Champions against Montpellier (34-27). Then, they got seven wins in Lidl Starligue, only team to do so, and four successes in Champions League.

LOOKING FAMILIAR

Six actual Paris' players who wore Barcelona jersey: Rodrigo Corrales, Mikkel Hansen, Nikola Karabatic, Viran Morros, Gudjon Valur Sigurdsson and Kamil Syprzak. On the other side, Barcelona's line player Cedric Sorhaindo played in Paris Handball between 2004 and 2009. During that frame, he won the 2007 Coupe de France.

EURO REFERENCE

Since 2015-2016 and the new format, Paris is the best team in Europe in the group phases with 105 pts earned (over 120). The 2nd best team with 98 pts is... Barcelona. Last season, the Rouge et Bleu finished at the 1st place of Group B with 26 pts. They broke a record of points in group phase since the introduction of the new format in 2015-2016.

OVER 800

Nikola Karabatic score three times against Ivry last Wednesday to cross the 800 career goals mark in Lidl Starligue. The famous number 44 scored 413 goals with Montpellier, 80 with Aix and 308 with Paris. Only two actual players of Paris have a better total than him: Luc Abalo (948) and Mikkel Hansen (1012).

GOLDEN PRIZE LIST

Barcelona owns one of the biggest club prize lists in handball. The team has 9 Champions League, a record, but also 2 Cup winners cup and 5 Superglobes. In Spain, Barcelona dominates the national competitions with 26 Spanish leagues, 23 Spanish cups, 14 ASOBAL cups and 22 Spanish supercups.

FRENCH CONNECTION

Barcelona has four French players who already played for the national team : Dika Mem, Cédric Sorhaindo, Ludovic Fabregas and Timothee Nguessan. In Paris, there are a total of 7 guys who played for the Bleus : the Karabatic brothers, Luc Abalo, Vincent Gérard, Benoît Kounkoud, Dylan Nahi and Nedim Remili.

CALL OF DUTY

9 Paris' players have been selected with their national team for next week: L.Abalo, V.Gérard, N.Remili and the Karabatic brothers with team France, R.Corrales and V.Morros with Spain, G.Sigurdsson with Iceland and K.Syprzak with Poland.

HIS FIRST

Sadou N'Tanzi made his debut in Champions League last week against Celje. The member of the U19 French national team scored twice. The center back from the youth system has now played 7 games with the pros.

51, WHAT A STREAK!

Paris set a new record for a French team last Sunday in Coubertin after winning against Celje (27-18). The Rouge et Bleu are unbeaten in Coubertin in the last 51 games, all competitions included, since June 8th 2017 vs Nantes. It is a new record for a French team. The former record was hold by Montpellier, who didn't lose any home game between Feb 2001 and Nov 2003. In Champions League, Paris has not lost in the last 39 home games (in Halle Carpentier and Coubertin). Last time Paris was beaten at home in Champions League was almost 5 years ago, on Nov 16th 2014 vs Kiel. In Lidl Starligue, the Rouge et Bleu are on a 29-game winning streak in Coubertin.

WITHOUT THE SCANDINAVIANS

Paris will play for the second time in a row without its Scandinavians. The two Danish, Henrik Toft Hansen and Mikkel Hansen, are still out both for concussion. The Norwegian Sander Sagosen is not fully back from his adductor muscle injury. The Swedish Kim Ekdahl du Rietz will miss his second game this week for illness.

Raul Gonzalez was born in 1970, in Spain in the city of Valladolid. He spent his entire professional career at BM Valladolid as center-back during 18 seasons (1987 to 2005). In 1996, at the Olympic Games in Atlanta, he won the bronze medal against France. He won two silver medals at the European Championships in 1996 and 1998.

He reconverted very quickly and became assistant coach of BM Ciudad Real in 2005. In 2014, he signs as head coach of RK Vardar Skopje, a position he held until 2018. With this club, he won three championships, four Macedonian cups and two SEHA leagues. Raul Gonzalez made a splash in 2017 by winning the Champions League against Paris. In 2018, he started a new challenge and became the coach of Paris-Saint-Germain where he met Luc Abalo, a player with whom he worked from 2008 to 2012 at BM Ciudad Real.

Raul Gonzalez arrived in the city of light with a reputation as a talented and experienced coach. In his first year with Paris Saint-Germain, he won the Lidl Starligue three games before the end of the championship, as well as the Coupe de la Ligue. Despite a defeat in the quarterfinals of the Champions League, the club of the French capital achieved a record season: 26 points combined in group stage, a new record since the introduction of the new competition system.

The Parisian coach starts the season 2019-2020 successfully by winning the Trophée des Champions against Montpellier, on the score of 34 to 27.

STADE PIERRE-DE-COUBERTIN

The Stade Pierre-de-Coubertin was inaugurated in 1937 as part of the World Exhibition. Following the damage caused by the Second World War, it was rebuilt in 1946. The major renovation of this historic stadium is from 1990.

Paris Saint-Germain Handball is the resident club. The Club did some work to personalize the stadium, including the creation of a weight room, a medical room or the installation of Rouge et Bleu colored seats, similar to the Parc des Princes.

Some additional work was carried out during the Summer 2016 to allow Paris Saint-Germain Handball to host Champions League matches. Since the 2016-2017 season, all home games are held at Stade Pierre-de-Coubertin. During handball matches, the capacity is 3,500 spectators.

Before starting the 2019-2020 season, Paris Saint-Germain Handball keep three following streaks at Stade Pierre-de-Coubertin. The Rouge et Bleu are undefeated in the last 51 home games in all competitions (50 wins and 1 tie against Kiel in March 2018). In Lidl Starligue, Paris has won the last 29 games played at home. And in Champions League, the team has never lost since the games are played in Coubertin, three full seasons and 28 games without defeats (26 wins and 2 draws).

Beyond gamedays, the Stade Pierre-de-Coubertin is where daily practices of the professional team and club youth system take place.

HISTORY

1941: The club was born in 1941 under the leadership of Christian Picard. At the beginning, the club's name was Patriots of Asnières before taking the name of Asnières Sports few years later.

1945: At the Parc des Princes, in front of 15 000 spectators, the team played its first Coupe de France final but lost against Villemomble. At this time, handball was still played with 11 players.

1987: The city of Paris agreed with the city of Asnières to create a big handball club in the French capital. The team moved in Paris and took a new name: Paris-Racing-Asnières before changing once again for Paris-Asnières.

1989: Paris attracted one of the best player of handball, Jackson Richardson. He wore the parisian jersey between 1989 and 1991. At this period, another future World Champion, Patrick Cazal, signed his first professional contract with the club.

1991/1992: The Paris Saint-Germain Omnisports, owned by Charles Biétry, has took control of the club called PSG-Asnières. Others sports section like volley-ball, rugby or boxing are launched by the Paris Saint-Germain.

1995/1996: Led by the 1995 World Champion and Olympic Games medalist Stéphane Stoecklin, the team finished 2nd of the French championship behind the OM-Vitrolles.

2000/2001: The Rouge & Bleu and Olivier Girault, winner of the World Cup few months before, lost against the Montpellier Handball during their first participation to the Coupe de France final.

2001/2002: A new chapter has been opened with Louis Nicollin, who stayed owner of the club until 2010.

2004/2005: Coached by Thierry Anti, the Rouge et Bleu ended the season at the 2nd place of the French championship and qualified for the 2005-2006 Champions League, where they lost in the round of 16.

2006/2007: The club earned his first trophy by winning against Aix-en-Provence in the Coupe de France final.

2009/2010: Down in 2nd division after the previous season, the team won the championship and moved back to 1st division.

2011/2012: Qatar Sports Investments became the new owner of the club, which is named Paris Saint-Germain Handball. Under the impulse of Nasser Al-Khelaifi, a new team is put in place.

2012/2013: The Paris Saint-Germain Handball, coached by the World Champion Philippe Gardent, won the French championship for the first time of its history. Some international stars were part of the team like Luc Abalo, Samuel Honrubia, Mikkel Hansen or Didier Dinart, which ended his career on this trophy.

2013/2014: With Daniel Narcisse, who joined the club at the beginning of the season, Paris reached the quarter-finals of the Champions League for the first time and won against Chambéry in the final of the Coupe de France.

2014/2015: The Parisians fought until the last game with Montpellier to win their second French championship title. Stronger with the arrival of Thierry Omeyer, the Paris Saint-Germain Handball realized an historic triple crown after winning the Trophée des Champions and the Coupe de France.

2015/2016: The Paris Saint-Germain Handball, which host a new coach, Zvonimir Serdarušić, and the Karabatic brothers at the summer 2015, won one more time the Trophée des Champions and in Lidl Starligue. The team participated for the first time to the Final Four of the Champions League, proving the rise in power of the club at the European level.

2016/2017: Another triple crown with a third Trophée des Champions, a third consecutive Lidl Starligue and a first win in Coupe de la Ligue. The Ligue des Champions ended by a crucial loss at the last second of the game in Final, against Skopje.

2017/2018: The Paris Saint-Germain Handball won for the first time Lidl Starligue - Coupe de France - Coupe de la Ligue. The Lidl Starligue title has been reached on the last week, which was also Daniel Narcisse last game, a true legend of French handball. In Champions league, Paris confirmed its power and qualified for Final4, where they ended at the third place.

2018/2019: Paris became national champion three games before the end of the Lidl Starligue. Eliminated in quarterfinals of Coupe de France against Montpellier, the Paris Saint-Germain Handball won one week after in Coupe de la Ligue for the third consecutive time. After breaking the record of points in Champions' League group phase, the Rouge & Bleu lost in quarterfinals against Kielce despite an incredible performance at the second leg in Coubertin. The end of season is marked by the retirement of the one of the best French handball player and best goalkeeper ever, Thierry Omeyer.
